



Curtains

The Murder-Mystery-Musical-Comedy

PLAYLOVERS production of *Curtains* is directed BY KRISTEN TWYNAM-PERKINS with musical direction by BELINDA FLINDELL, and choreography by TAMMIE ANNE RAFFERTY,

"Whatever you do, don't let the curtain go down on *Curtains* without seeing it!

You'll have so much fun and laugh so hard it'll kill you!"

In a collision of theatrical traditions – Agatha Christie meets 42nd Street – Curtains is a backstage whodunit with a clever and contagiously catchy toe-tapping score.

Set in 1959 Boston, the cast and crew of a Broadway-bound musical all become suspects after someone is murdered on stage. Detective Frank Cioffi is called in to solve the murder. While investigating, Cioffi finds himself in the middle of theatrical egos and eccentricities, deceit, and a budding love affair. A huge fan of musical theatre himself, Cioffi even has some suggestions on how to improve *Robin' Hood! A New Musical of the Old West.*

Curtains is based on an original concept by Peter Stone. Stone, however, died in 2003 before it was completed and Rupert Holmes (one-time pop song writer and Tony-winning playwright-Drood) was hired to rewrite the book. The show premiered July 25, 2006 at the Ahmanson Theatre, Los Angeles. It transferred to Broadway in March 2007 and was nominated for eight Tony-Awards. The cast included David Hyde Pierce who won the Tony for Best Performance by a Leading Actor in a Musical.

Curtains authors John Kander (composer) and Fred Ebb (lyricist) were among the longest running music and lyrics partnerships in Broadway musical history; along with Rogers and Hart/Hammerstein. Among their award winning works are Cabaret, Chicago and Kiss of the Spider Woman. Ebb passed away at 71 before Curtains transferred to Broadway, ending a very successful and decades-long affiliation

Cast

Tyler Jones - LT Frank Cioffi

Tyler has been an active member of Playlovers since 2006. He has appeared in many productions, including *Eurobeat, Bare, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Jonah* and *Spamalot*, as well as directing *Ruthless: the Musical* and *Side Show*. Most recently, Tyler collaborated with Robert Woods on the original musical *Falling to the Top*, which began its life at Playlovers and went on to win the Artrage Award for Best WA Theatre Production at Perth's 2013 Fringe World Festival. Professionally,



Tyler has appeared in *Blood Brothers* with Amanda Muggleton for Janus Entertainment, and toured Perth schools with Perform Educational Musicals.

Claire Taylor - Niki Harris

Claire first stepped out on the stage in 1989 as a wee little dancing girl, and not much has changed since then. Twenty four years later, and after an infinite number of competitions and exams, she is still dancing. Somewhere along the road an interest in music was developed which then led to singing lessons and the inevitable addiction to Musical Theatre. Claire completed Cert II Music Theatre at WAAPA in 2004 and racked up many professional singing engagements before running away to London for 3 1/2 years. Since returning she has joined the Perth community theatre scene and has loved every minute of it. Her most recent roles include Violet Hilton in Side Show for which she won a Finley Award in 2011 for Best Actress in a Musical. Princess Amneris in Aida for which she won Best Actress at the Marloo Awards 2012, Tonya Fillamundo in Falling To The Top which won Best WA Theatre Production at the 2013 Perth Fringe Festival, and Pamela Edwards in The 39 Steps.

She is very much looking forward to sinking her teeth into a musical again and feels privileged to be working with such a talented cast and crew.

Helen was meant to make her stage debut at the age of four, but got lost on a scary staircase backstage and missed her cue. She studied Drama Education at ECU and has been involved in community theatre for over 20 years, doing shows with Encore Theatre Company, Music Makers Unlimited, The Blue Room, One Night Stand Theatre, Bunbury Musical Comedy Group, Sundance Theatre and Playlovers. Favourite roles over the years include Rizzo from *Grease*, and Lucy in *You're A Good Man Charlie Brown*. Helen has been busy breeding mini-thespians, and is very excited to be back on stage after a 3 year hiatus.

PLAYLOVERS COMMITTEE - INTRODUCING ALIDA CHANEY



Alida was bitten by the performance bug at a very early age. She found it was a way to exorcise her extreme shyness, as when she was on-stage she could be someone else. Performing since her first professional production in the UK at the age of 11 years, she also studied Voice, Drama and Dance at various schools there. Arriving in Australia over 14 years ago, she has totally thrown herself in Perth's theatre world.

She has had many and varied career changes, having been a Personal Assistant, Financial Advisor, Horse Riding Instructor and in various office positions. She now is a 'Happy Feet Fitness' Instructor working with very small children in Day Care. Happy Feet is a fitness and educational programme for young children which helps to build confidence and teaches coordination. She also teaches Musical Theatre and Drama at three different theatre schools to children of all ages.

Alida has always loved children, having four of her own, three girls and a boy, of whom she is immensely proud. The youngest, Amy, is following her footsteps closely, having just choreographed *The Rink* at Playlovers. Her long time (and long suffering) partner Leon has five children and people are always commenting that they have more kids than The Brady Bunch!

Alida has taken on the role of Secretary on the committee, one that she had not considered prior to being persuaded by David Young, who told her it only was a matter of taking minutes and typing them up. She has since found that there is a little more to it than that!

But she has many years of experience on Community Theatre Committees, having been on one for 3 years in the UK before coming to Australia, then serving as Publicity and Marketing Officer on Wanneroo Repertory's committee for 5 years and continuing there as a committee member for another 3 years. She therefore feels that she is worthy of sitting on ours.

Alida has appeared in many productions at Playlovers, Limelight Theatre, MS Society, Theatre Bits, Pristine Entertainment, Event Masters and Stirling Players.

She has also performed at the Burswood Theatre (newly named the Crown), the Regal Theatre and in Cabaret at 'Rigby's' on St Georges Terrace.

Some of her stage credits include: Miss Hannigan in *Annie*, Madame Victoire in *Les Miserables*, Jean Sod in *Lucky Sods*, Adelaide in *Guys and Dolls*, Erma in *Anything Goes*, Sister Robert-Anne in *Nunsense*, Bobbi in *Last of The Red Hot Lovers*, Edith in 'Allo, 'Allo, Nellie in *Jekyll & Hyde* and, when she was much, much younger, Laurey in *Oklahoma*!

The last couple of years Alida has taken on the Director's mantle and so far has directed two musicals, *Blood Brothers* at the Limelight Theatre, and last year she directed *The Rink* for Playlovers. She also produced last year's Plovers Awards and Christmas Show for Playlovers.

At present she is directing Lost in Yonkers at The Limelight Theatre, her first play. She enjoys directing, but also still loves to be in the spotlight, although the roles for middle aged females are few and far between, she says. She knows that her life would have been very empty without 'theatre' and all of the close friendships she has formed over the years because of it.


