

QUARTERMAINE'S TERMS

By Simon Gray Directed by Alaric Korb

Set in the 1960s, in a school, where foreign students study English in Cambridge, England, this play is an often humorous but ultimately moving account of several years in the lives of seven teachers.

At the centre of the group is St John Quartermaine; agreeable and pleasant but hopeless as a teacher and desperately lonely outside his school life. He is, it seems an almost permanent fixture in the staff-room, always available to listen to the personal problems of his self-obsessed colleagues; each of whom harbours a private tragedy - a philandering husband, a dying partner, a parasitical mother, a neurotic child.

The role of St John (pronounced Sinjon) has been immortalized by such celebrated actors as Edward Fox and Michael Palin. The last professional production of this play starred Rowan Atkinson as the lead character 'Quartermaine' at The Wyndham's Theatre on the West End in London. It received fabulous reviews; not only for Atkinson's superb performance, but also for the play itself.

An excerpt from The Daily Telegraph review stated; "Quartermaine's Terms, first staged in 1981, is perhaps Simon Gray's finest work, an English drama that can stand comparison with Chekhov in its ability to combine comedy with a powerful undertow of melancholy and loss"

Simon Gray began his writing career as a novelist in 1963 while teaching at the University of London. Over the next 45 years, in addition to 5 published novels, he wrote 40 original stage plays, screenplays, and screen adaptations of his own and others' works for stage, film, and television and became well known for the self-deprecating wit characteristic of several volumes

of memoirs or diaries. This multi-award winning English playwright has had the honour of winning Best Play at 4 of the major international theatre awards including the Writer's Guild, the Evening Standard, the New York Drama Critics' Circle, the Drama Desk Awards, as well as the Cheltenham Literary Prize, which he won for "Quartermaine's Terms".



Director Alaric Korb, who makes his debut for Playlovers, is an exciting new director who will no doubt breathe fresh light and insight into this highly comic, yet poignantly telling production.

JENNY McNAE

Jenny McNae is recognised as one of Western Australia's leading theatre practitioners. She is a director, actor and tutor of theatre arts, was Artistic Director of the Hole in the Wall Theatre for 2 years and has worked with all WA's major theatre companies.

Her 50 year professional career includes acting for film, TV and radio, choreography, writing and script development, adjudication and many artist-in-residencies.

She served on the Women's Advisory Council to the Premier and, as President, hosted the international conference Women in Sport and the Arts. In 2009, she was awarded the Order of Australia medal for services to the performing arts.

For Agelink Theatre she has performed in *Quartet* in Perth and on the National Tour, directed *As Ships Pass By, Wireless Head* and *Here to Stay* (Edinburgh Festival), and co-created *A Colonial Christmas Carol.*

ITA WEBSITE

The **Independent Theatre Association** (**ITA**) has been re-vamping its web presence. The old **Theatre Australia** website, www.theatre.asn.au, is no longer operational. Instead, the ITA are developing their website, http://www.ita.org.au, to provide much of the functionality that the old website had.

They have already started to provide a What's On section called **Footlights**, http://footlights.ita.org.au. Theatre groups can now submit information about upcoming productions or auditions. These are then presented in calendar format or list format, and of course you can search for particular events...

Items are colour-coded to distinguish between different types of events: auditions, plays, musicals, etc. The calendar format displays events for a particular month, so you can see what clashes with what, and plan your entertainment accordingly. Upcoming auditions and productions can be imported into your calendar (iCal or Google Calendar).

The ITA website also has reviews of productions by Gordon the Optom, http://www.ita.org.au/reviews.

In a few weeks, the ITA are meeting with the member theatre groups to review how the new website is working and discuss what improvements might be made.
