### Subscription To Love

#### Written and Directed by Will Dunlop

THREE DAYS ONLY - March 13, 14, 15

A Modern Day Tragi-Comedy Written In lambic Pentameter

This March sees the World Premiere of a new, locally written production set right here in Perth. Subscription To Love written and directed by Claremont resident Will Dunlop, is the story of a group of local 20 somethings as they navigate the trials and tribulations of the modern romantic landscape. Performed in iambic pentameter and structured like the great classics of William Shakespeare, this tragic-comedy contends with not only the pitfalls of love in an age of social rules, political correctness, scientific studies and unrealistic Hollywood portrayals of love and destiny, but is not afraid to address issues surrounding race, sexuality, equality and the current Australian political landscape.

Subscription to Love exposes the anxieties evoked by the world of romance. Each character sees themselves as the central role in their life's story and yet feels as though life is beyond their control. Written in verse and iambic pentameter like the epic stories by William Shakespeare, the characters' emotions and thoughts are guided by the pace and rhythm of the text. With as much monologue as dialogue, you gain uncensored access to the insights, confusions, joys, mistakes and fears that are harboured by each character. Even in the hi-tech global world of instant communication and readily available public broadcasting, we are bound by the same emotional pitfalls and failures by miscommunication that humanity has always faced.

The play is a tribute to Shakespeare's work, filled with references to his plays that are applied to a very modern setting. There are also literary references to many other great writers including Oscar Wilde, Banjo Paterson and Anton Chekov. The poetic nature of the language is a vehicle for demonstrating that the heightened text of so many epic stories in history applies equally to the troubles we face in today's busy society.

### **AUDITION - QUARTERMAINE'S TERMS**

#### A rueful social comedy

The play takes place over a period of two years in the 1960s in the staffroom at a Cambridge school for teaching English to foreigners. It deals with the interrelationship between seven teachers at the school. Whilst the play is at times highly comic, the struggles of each character with their own type of loneliness are moving and sad. Simon Gray takes his fascination with the English sense of detachment to unusual lengths.

#### Character breakdown

St. John Quartermaine	Male Age 40-50	Quartermaine is a dozy buffer, useless at teaching, socially not so much clumsy as a non-starter. He is part of the furniture and is treated as the resident agony uncle for his self-obsessed colleagues.
Anita Manchip	Female Age 20-40	Anita is one of the younger teachers who is deceived by her philandering husband (never seen). She is a strong woman, but tends to shy away from confronting her husband until going to confront him mid-way through the play. She is one of the kindest staff members and appears to always try to conceal her emotions.
Mark Sackling	Male Age 30-50	Early in the play Mark's wife leaves him, plunging him into an emotional rollercoaster as he writes for his new magazine. Usually a reliable member of staff, the separation makes him more focused on the finishing of his magazine and the yearning to be reunited with his son.
Eddie Loomis	Male Age 50-70	Eddie is one of the school heads who is ultimately betrayed by his partner. Throughout the play Eddie's physical well-being diminishes and he ultimately ends up partially blind and almost unable to walk unaided. He is quintessentially British and always is most proper in his dealings with his subordinates.
Derek Meadle	Male Age 20-40	Derek is the newcomer to the school and is continually undervalued by the others. It appears that he is liked by the pupils at the school and over time gains the respect of the staff.
Henry Windscape	Male Age 40-60	Henry is trapped in a dysfunctional nuclear family. He is the heir apparent to take over the school and is generally treated as superior to the others, however is always friendly and is one of the liveliest in the staff room.
Melanie Garth	Female Age 30-50	Melanie is trapped caring for a mother whom she despises. She is one of the most reliable members of staff and (though initially reluctant) becomes increasingly involved in a church group that tends to become an obsession.

Auditionees will need to read an excerpt from Scene 1 of the play which will be provided before the audition (or if time doesn't permit, can be provided on the day).
