



Following the Black Sheep

By Yvette Wall
Directed by Campbell Greenock

11-13 September 2015

The inner workings of a family just after the end of World War II are explored in *Following The Black Sheep*.

Written by Perth playwright Yvette Wall and directed by Campbell Greenock, the play is set in 1946 and focuses on Jack who, haunted by his past, returns home from the war to stay with his sister Shirley and her family. Tensions rise when Shirley's headstrong daughter Frances has to make an important decision about her future and Jack forms an affinity with her.

"The war has had a great affect on all the characters and we particularly get to see how one man has been forever changed by what he has gone through," Greenock said. "It is also a story about being true to yourself because the teenage daughter has to choose between her mother's wishes and her own."

Wall adds: "A friend told me a story about her uncle, a pacifist, who was an army stretcher bearer in Bougainville during World War II – it was very touching. I developed the rest of the story fictitiously from there. I admire and am inspired by those who remain true to themselves under trying circumstances."

Acting for the past three years, Greenock has performed with the WA Youth Theatre Company in productions such as MINE and The Dreaming Hill and has also recently become a board member.

Following The Black Sheep is his first time as a director and he says the main challenge is to quickly understand his own method of directing.

"This includes knowing how to express my vision to the cast while also listening to their ideas and allowing them the opportunity to explore their own characters," Greenock said. "Working with some great actors has definitely helped in this regard – I have hit the jackpot with Sienna Freeman who is only 10 but takes direction easily and also has her own ideas about her character.

"The first time I read the play I knew there were many interesting character developments that would be fun to flesh out with the actors.

"Having been approached by the writer to direct the piece was a huge compliment and I have jumped at the opportunity to make this great script come to life."

The Wardrobe

By Sam Holcroft Directed by Kimberley and Elisabeth Shaw 11-13 September 2015



Mother and daughter Kimberley and Elisabeth Shaw have united to direct *The Wardrobe* at Playlovers Theatre both passionate about producing meaningful and this September – and it also features Kimberley's

youngest daughter Stephanie in the production.

Written by Sam Holcroft, The Wardrobe is set over a 530-year period and tells the stories of various young people who seek refuge or comfort in the same wardrobe between 1485 and 2015.

From the War Of The Roses' last days, through English Civil War brutality, paranoia of the Plague and heartbreak of World War I conscription, right up to modern-day complications with social networking, the play seamlessly weaves humour with moments in history that ultimately depict the loss of innocence.

Holcroft is currently writer-in-residence at the UK's National Theatre Studio and she was commissioned to write the play as part of the 2014 National Theatre Connections Festival.

The Wardrobe features 23 actors aged between 11 and 17 – and 10 of them have professional credits to their names.

Aside from Elisabeth and Stephanie, the cast also features four sets of siblings including two sets of twins.

"Elisabeth and I were keen to do a show together and are challenging theatre for young people," Kimberley said.

> "Directing a show that takes place literally in the confines of a wardrobe is challenging to stage."

Involved in theatre for more than 20 years, Kimberley has worked with Blak Yak, KADS, Playlovers, Roleystone and Kwinana Theatres and is a former president and current committee member of the Independent Theatre Association, as well as being a performing arts specialist teacher at Sawyers Valley Primary School.

She has several awards to her credit, twice winning best production and best youth production at Dramafest, the

annual state drama festival, and also twice scored the best musical gong at the Finley Awards.

Elisabeth has been directing for three years, twice winning best production at Youthfest for The Evacuees and Izzy Icarus Fell off the Earth.

She has also won the Finley Award for youth for sound design and operation and has worked as a stage manager, sound operator and actor for numerous productions.

How I came to be involved with Playlovers:


