





Seating Update


Arrangements for the arrival of the seating is going according to plan. The wiring has been completed and we just await the actual seats.

The system will allow us to roll out the seats from 1 metre to 7 metres in depth, and will be eight rows high. There will be a centre aisle with eight seats either side of that aisle, except for the top row which will have two extra seats making this row 18 seats wide, thus giving a total of 130 seats.

Each seat will be fully upholstered, with backrest, in a rich red colour.

If all these raised seats are allocated, we can provide three rows of extra seating in front of this system, using the older style seats. When we raise further funds, extra upholstered seats can be purchased.

The Hall is Ours!!

On Sunday April 4th 2009 at 1500 hours, the lease agreement for Hackett Hall between Nedlands City Council and Playlovers was signed. There for the historic occasion were our President, Marie Corrigan, and Vice President, David Young, and the man of the moment, Terry Tinsley. Terry the tenacious!

Terry only joined Playlovers committee in 2005 and immediately began badgering and cajoling the Nedlands City Council to give us the hall. Prior to that, our immediate past-Presidents, Alex McLennan and David Young, had spent many years working on the task – and, we like to think, softening up the Council!



However, it was Terry's dogged persistence that finally won the day. They finally gave up in 2006 - after we sent them a formal proposal. In return, they gave us a (not very favourable) lease agreement. And another one! Then another one! Seven in all! Terry the Tornado! I had worked out that he spent 200 hours with the Nedlands City Council at meetings; they probably thought that he was on their payroll!

Thank You, Terry!!

What does this all mean?

Well, we have to pay a peppercorn rent... Hurrah!

We have to clean, maintain and insure the hall, seek approval for change and manage others who wish to use the hall. And inspections will take place. It's a 10 year lease, with a 5 year extension.

This is the biggest change in Playlovers history, probably since we got the hall in 1960.

The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee

Music and Lyrics by William Finn Book by Rachel Sheinkin Director - Kimberley Shaw

Spelling Bee, a musical comedy, centres around a fictional spelling bee set in a geographically ambiguous Putnam Valley Middle School. Six quirky adolescents compete in the Bee, run by three equally-quirky grown-ups.

One third of the Spelling Bee cast are completely new to Playlovers. We thought you might be interested in finding out more about them.

Lauchlan Bain

Lauchlan plays William Barfee (it's pronounced Barfay), a slightly odd kid, with a mucous membrane disorder. William finds out a lot about himself during the show, and Lauchlan's portrayal is superb. Best known as a dancer, we get to see Lauchlan's talents in a fabulous number called Magic Foot and in a pas de deux.

You may have seen Lauchlan as a Kit Kat Girl in Wanneroo Repertory's *Cabaret* or in the role of Jack in *Fame*. Lauchlan has completed a Certificate II in Music Theatre at WAAPA and is presently studying for a Bachelor of Arts in English, Dance and Music, and Education.

We get to keep Lauchlan for a while, as he will shortly appear as Scripps in the Playlovers production of *The History Boys*.

Jeanette auditioned for Spelling Bee in our thirteenth hour of auditions, when we thought we had made up our minds. She blew us away as a potential Marcy Park and forced us to rethink our decisions. She has continued to impress us ever since and is absolutely delightful as the petite over-achiever who is good at everything she tries. Jeanette is a bit like this in real life... She first began studying music at the age of four by playing the piano and violin. She then went onto complete a Bachelor of Music Education at UWA and subsequently a Master of Music from the University of Queensland. She freelances as a violinist and also helps conduct string orchestras for WAYMA. You may have seen Jeanette in the ensembles of the MS Society's South Pacific and Wanneroo's Fame. We think she'll blow you away in her first leading role.

*Answer the questionnaire you'll be given honestly and BE YOURSELF. (We're not looking for people to show off...the show is great on its own.)

* We will be looking for variety in terms of age, gender and personality, so a big part will be

The History Boys

An unruly bunch of bright, funny sixth from boys in pursuit of sex, sport and a place at university. A maverick English teacher at odds with the young and shrewd supply teacher. A headmaster obsessed with results, a history teacher who thinks he's a fool.

In Alan Bennett's new play, staff-room rivalry and the anarchy of adolescence provoke insistent questions about history and how you teach it; about education and its purpose.
