

Presidents Report

Welcome to all our Playlovers members.

2017 was a year of turmoil and resilience.

Hackett Hall



With no success from this, we continued the process with the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT). At the SAT Hearings, the Council Engineer, under pressure from the mediator and our engineer conceded he had been incorrect in his assessment of the dangerous state of the building. There were also key concessions made by the council's electrician. This resulted in a win to Playlovers and our keys were returned in mid-August.

However, there were conditions. Works determined by SAT and additional works decided by the council were to be completed in 60 days.

Since then there have been continual meetings and inspections:

Council inspected Hackett Hall.

Meeting request with Deputy Mayor, Bill Hassell.

Met with new Councillor, Cilla De Lacy, who championed our cause.

Met with the council CEO and Manager of Strategy.

Met with Council Buildings Manager, Assets Lease Officer and Environmental Health Officer and given further things to do.

I also sent a letter outlining our current situation to the new Minister for the Arts and Culture, Local Government and Heritage, Mr David Templeman. Our wonderful Patron, Kay Hallahan, and I attended a meeting with the Minister's Director General, Mr Duncan Ord, and two of his key policy advisers. The outcome of this meeting was that they were going to request that the City of Nedlands attend a meeting with them at Dumas House to explain their actions and treatment of a community group.

A request was made by the council for me to provide an outline of all professional reports gained during the 60 day SAT and Council works program (reports that they already have) along with an outline of what future works we intend to carry out at Hackett Hall

The Council sent in an architect and pest control firm to review the hall and provide a list of costings for the building to bring it to an appropriate level of renovation for community use. What this means' I'm not sure! We are still waiting on an outline of this inspection, but have been told it revealed an asbestos issue and the Council has closed off this section of the hall until further notice.

While we are closer than this time last year, we are still a fair way off using the hall for performances again.

A massive thank you to Mark Burns for getting us to this point.

Thank you also to Mr Dion Voss whose report on the structural integrity of Hackett Hall helped thwart the council's move to have the building condemned.

Thank you Mark Nicholson for providing a financial report to council.

Thank you engineer, Graham Cook, for providing plans and supporting documentation for the stage extension.

Hello members

Well it's been a long time between newsletters but it definitely doesn't mean that things aren't happening OR that Playlovers has ceased to exist. Your committee is busily trying to source venues in order for us to maintain a theatrical footprint in 2018. On the horizon is a production of "Side By Side By Sondheim" directed by Gill Binks and musical direction by Sean Davis. Wanneroo Repertory has very kindly offered us the use of their venue for a July / August season. The audition notice for this season can be found within this newsletter. If you know anyone who may be interested in auditioning please pass on the information.

On the Hackett Hall front we have been forced to play the waiting game with the City of Nedlands. Earlier this year they sent in an Architect to prepare a report on the state of Hackett Hall. We then waited 6 weeks for this report! There were no surprises in this report considering that it is a 60 year old building. The estimate to bring this 60 year old building up to speed was \$2,000,000. Our stance is that this building requires maintenance NOT an upgrade!

Back in January our Club Patron and I met the Director General and the Key Policy Advisers for the Minister of Local Government, Heritage and the Arts to make them aware of our situation and to seek their advice. While no guarantees were made they did express their support for us in our battle and assured us that they would look into this further.

In April, Mark Burns and I were summoned to a meeting with the council and in particular the CEO, Greg Trevaskis. Considering the Architects Report and a subsequent document received from the council in late March we expected to be walking into a 'Ding Dong' battle for Hackett Hall where all gloves would off! In the end it was anything but a battle. To cut a long story short, we have been given an indefinite timeframe to complete a list of works at Hackett Hall of the maintenance variety. This list consists of works to the roof, electrical checks, plumbing inspections, safety equipment inspections and a new emergency exit from the courtyard to name a few. Once all these items have been completed the council have guaranteed that they will sign off on Playlovers gaining full use of Hackett Hall. Our intention is to have all these items completed in time for a January / February 2019 season launch. The other good news from this meeting was the council's agreement that the building could be used for another 15 – 20 years and that they'd look at spending a significant amount of money to, in the CEO's words, "make the place look nice". We intend on holding them to their word!!

So things are the most positive that they have been for a long time. Please continue to support the club in our endeavours to maintain an existence at Hackett Hall. You can do this by coming to see our shows in 2018 and getting the word out in the community that Playlovers is well and truly alive and kicking!





43rd Robert Finley Awards 2017

Playlovers had nominations in a number of categories despite our limited seasons. These were:

Best Director of a Play (Barry Park,),

Best Actress in a Play (both Sally Barendse and Cate Jennings),

Best Supporting Actress in a Play (Chandra Wyatt),

The Brenda Stanley Award for Best Costumes in a Play, and

The David Crewes Award for Best Set in a Play.

All nominations came from Other Desert Cities



On the night, there was only one winner from the above; The David Crewes Award for Best Set in a Play.

However, *Other Desert Cities* was placed 3rd in the award for Best Play and *Jungle Book* was given an Adjudicator's Certificate:

"For characterization and puppetry skills – Charlie Young, *Jungle Book*, Playlovers"

Charlie played Kaa, the snake.

and an Adjudicator's certificate that has absolutely no connection with Playlovers, but which tickled my fancy
